CHAIRMAN'S LETTER:

Thank goodness summer is on its way, this past year has been very difficult for all levels of Council.

We have experienced drought conditions in March 2012 and floods during the last quarter of 2012 and early 2013. Heavier than normal snow caused road conditions to become a hazard as we all tried to continue a normal working life in sub-zero conditions. With all the weight of the snow and ice on the trees many areas lost power and local teams worked day and night to restore power.

Your Parish Council has worked hard during the year to maintain a service to you the residents whilst trying to maintain costs. The coming years show signs of being even more difficult as we face further cuts in services at both District and County levels. If only people realised the cost of having to pick up litter discarded without thought or not picking up after your dog. As part of our future plans we, your local Parish Council, are trying to find ways of keeping this an area we are all proud to live in. Road sweeping, litter picking and keeping the verges cut are areas that have been identified by local people. Planning consents are monitored by your Parish Planning Committee and we have on many occasions attended East Dorset District Council Planning meeting to ensure that your views are noted. Several applications have been refused due to the pressure put forward by your local Councillors.

We fully support the local community in providing what has become a centre of excellence with the growing Braeside Rd complex. Both the Bowls and Tennis Club have grown in numbers; the Village Hall has been maintained to a very high standard in comparison to other

Village Halls in the area and maintains a high level of occupancy. Other Halls in the area receive large subsidies from EDDC; this council has to provide subsidies from our own coffers.

A number of on-going issues within the Parish have seen much better attendances at our monthly meetings. It is great to see that you are interested in what is happening locally and are willing to help us make what at times are difficult decisions. Your thoughts and comments could make a difference.

ALLOTMENTS

Some two years ago after the publication of the Localism Act I was asked with two other councillors to form a sub-committee to investigate the possibility of a site in the Parish for allotments.

To date we have investigated four sites, three not in our ownership and one other in our ownership. None of these were thought to be at all acceptable, for a variety of reasons.

At present the Parish have a report from an officer from EDDC whose job it is to help find suitable sites for this purpose. The site in question is the recreation field at Horton Road covenanted to the Parish Council by Lord Normanton.

A preliminary discussion was held on the 27th February at the Parish meeting at which several residents were present. They voiced their strong concerns and objections stating several reasons as to why this should not be allowed to happen.

A full investigation has yet to take place and several issues are yet to be discussed. It will be a long time before anything is likely to be decided and many misunderstandings have already taken place. The Parish Agenda which is always placed on the notice boards seven days before the meeting will always advise residents as to when this issue is likely to be discussed.

BUS SERVICE UPDATE

On the 12th of February I attended a consultation meeting with the County Officers at the Community Centre in Ferndown. The object of the meeting was to establish with County whether their subsidy was adequate. It

was an extremely interesting meeting and the issues were discussed in full.

It was pointed out that new buses could cost anywhere between £100,000 to £180,000 and all costs had escalated over the past few years. With representatives from the bus companies present, it was obvious that the overall view was that the figure of £3 subsidy from Dorset County Council which has been in place for several years should rise. This £3 was for every journey on the buses taken by fare paying passengers. Concessionary fare ticket holders do not fall into this category. After a very long debate it was obvious that those present, who represented all Parishes had varying views, but the majority by far, felt that an increase was necessary. Suggestions from £5 to £20 were made. There was no majority view but the officers said they would go back and consider all that was said and await the result of the public consultation which can be filled in by going to www.dorsetforyou.com/busconsultation

Or alternatively, by filling in the form which can be obtained from the Parish Clerks office. (Open Tues, Weds or Thurs between 10.30am-12.30pm.)

Before the meeting closed I did personally thank the people from Wilts and Dorset Buses, for their hard work in delivering our very successful bus service, which is much appreciated by the residents of St Leonards and St Ives. They assured me that the service would continue as they realised just how well it was used.

HOT OFF THE PRESS. East Dorset District Council have voted to keep the subsidy towards concessionary fares until the year 2016, this includes pre 9.30am.

ANOTHER SUCCESSFUL YEAR FOR THE TENNIS CLUB

We have our own very popular Head Coach, Paul Handford, who has two full time qualified coaches, Andy Wells and Carl Shoulders working with him, as well as a number of helpers.

This enables us to have over 120 youngsters enjoying playing, competing and joining in coaching sessions which include lively holiday clubs. Standards are high, beginners make progress and much fun is had!

The club has around 230 Junior and Senior members, most of whom play at least once a week. Our summer tournament was an outstanding success, triumphing over the weather. Over 220 matches were played during 5 months with 90 adult entrants. On Finals Day the balcony and clubhouse were full from 10am until the presentations in the evening. A stunning array of cup cakes, tasty baguettes and a flaming BBQ ensured members and guests alike maintained their energy.

Adult competition includes regular internal Box Leagues and informal club sessions, where all players mix in, on Sundays, Mondays and Thursdays and on Friday and especially Tuesday evenings which are exceptionally popular.

We enjoy many social functions including mulled wine and mince pies at Christmas Club Night, a Chinese food night, quizzes and curry nights.

Plans at present include refurbishing our excellent carpeted courts and before long we shall need to renew the floodlights, so prudent financial management is essential and we are lucky to have a very canny treasurer (Paul Woodruff) and supportive members.

The collapse in January of three big retail names - HMV, Jessops and Blockbuster only highlights such problems and even in more affluent retail areas premises are being taken over by Betting Shops, Fast Food outlets and Charity Shops.

In many villages and small communities there are Sub-Post offices trapped in 'Last Shop in the Village' situations so the creation of a Post Office Bank could be very welcome. Never before has the slogan 'Use it or Lose it' been more important. You have been warned and this means YOU!!!!

Firstly, I must thank everyone who has supported the Village Hall since my article last year.

The latter months of last year were spent working to raise much needed money towards the refurbishment of the main hall floor. The total price quoted was £4,000 and we managed to get grant funding from three sources which equated to £2,550. We then had to work very hard to raise the remaining £1,450. This we did by holding a Chinese night at CHEF da CHINA, which raised £424 and the Community day raised £813. This left us to find £217; a donation from one of the hall user groups has helped in this regard.

We had a large nearly new fridge freezer donated by a local resident, for which we are very grateful.

There are still improvements to be made but not immediately. A committee working party is slowly painting several rooms.

We have a very exciting fund raising event on JUNE 15th 2013, which is a concert by the DORSET POLICE MALE VOICE CHOIR but, due to numbers and space, it is to be held at St Mary's Church Hall, Ferndown, starting at 7.00pm; tickets £8. YOUR NHS

“No decision about me without me” is at the heart of the government's reform of the NHS. The idea is to shift decision making as close as possible to you the patient.

The new NHS comes into being from 1st April 2013 and will be a radical change from the way things have been run hither to. Newly formed Clinical Commissioning Groups (CCGs) will decide the services to be delivered and commission providers (hospitals and others) to provide them.

CCGs have to be able to be able to show how they will ensure inclusion of patients, the public, communities of interest, local communities, health and well being boards, and local authorities (parish councils) in their commissioning decisions. They have to develop procedures for gaining a broad range of views, analysing and acting on them. The process needs to be transparent and it should be evident how the views of individual patients, the various groups and the public are translated into clinical commissioning decisions and acted on.

Easy to say or write down. As always the problems are in the detail of how to do it.

Most of us in the parish are patients of Cornerways or Ringwood Medical Centre both of which come under West Hampshire CCG which is based in Eastleigh. It also has one of the largest geographic areas to cover.

To meet its obligations the West Hampshire CCG has set up a Communications and Engagement Group comprising representatives of a range of interest groups and geographic areas. This area and indeed West New Forest which is the geographic area of which we are a part was not represented.

The purpose of the group is to facilitate two way communication between the CCG and local areas

and patient groups. The intention is to consult as widely as possible particularly with hard to reach groups (that is you).

A further aim of the group is to explain local health services and how expectations are to be met, enhance public understanding of how the new system is intended to work, and demonstrate accountability.

I have been appointed to the group as a patient member which means at my own cost (no expenses paid) but have for the moment undertaken to facilitate communication and consultation with various groups in the locality. Through these newsletters I will involve the Parish Council in any consultations. I will also involve other interest groups if I am aware of their interest. One such group is the Cornerways Patient Participation Group of which I am a member, and which I urge Cornerways patients to support.
